

Protect – First Purpose

To conserve and enhance the natural beauty, wildlife and cultural heritage of the area



Re:New Nature

- Local Nature Recovery Strategies – Wiltshire and Hampshire
- Team Nature meeting of conservation directors at hosted by North Yorks Moors NPA (see photos)
- Re:New Nature at the New Forest Show
- Hosted eNGO leaders and NPA CXs
- Members session on nature recovery



Species Survival Fund

- £1.3m scheme to restore New Forest habitats and increase wildlife.
- Improving 250 hectares for nature over more than 20 sites – the equivalent of 350 football pitches.
- Six partners (Freshwater Habitats Trust; Amphibian and Reptile Conservation; Commoners Defence Association; Wildlife Trust, Wild New Forest, NFNPA) plus support from the RSPB and New Forest Biodiversity Forum.
- 11 sites surveyed, recording over 650 different species.
- Staff recruited.
- Project Board established.

Future farming in the New Forest update

- Farming in Protected Landscapes into last 6 months; 28,556 ha of projects over scheme lifetime
- Environmental Land Management scheme: feasibility study to identify a successor scheme to Higher Level Stewardship scheme progressed with a workshop and consultation discussions

Schemes for nature through planning

- Strategic access management and mitigation measures (SAMM): co-ordinating the work of neighbouring planning authorities and other partners to address recreational impacts on the New Forest's designated sites.
- Bird Aware Solent: Revised strategy for scheme to mitigate potential recreational impacts of planned new development.



Water and New Forest Catchment Partnership

- Blue Horizons legacy – habitat restoration, creation and management.
- Wilder for Water – citizen science.
- Stand at New Forest Show with Beaulieu Estate (right).




Planning

- 125 applications received 1 July to 23 September and 108 applications determined (approval rate of 94%)
- Three appeal decisions received (two dismissed, one allowed).
- 58 new enforcement cases, 64 concluded.



Planning policy

- Minerals and waste plan to SoS for independent examination
- Planning Consultations:
 - National Planning Policy reform proposals - responses both local and national
 - Solent CO2 pipeline, now dropped

- Iron Age – Romano British settlement at Fordingbridge (top)
- Thorney Hill investigation of 1920s Gypsies and Travellers compound when no longer allowed to camp out on the open forest. Filmed by Channel 4's 'Digging for Britain (below right)
- East Boldre graves recording with volunteers (below left)
- Penny Moor access over SAM for wetland scheme



Enjoy – Second Purpose

To promote opportunities for the understanding and enjoyment of the special qualities of the National Park by the public.



YouCAN (youth for climate and nature) first year highlights

- NPA highlights: Youth board – first session held with a residential at Fort Climate Centre (right); 13 junior ranger sessions; new youth volunteering programme.
- 19 sessions of a new Young Adult Ranger work experience programme at The Parks Foundation, Bournemouth, alongside five Bournemouth University students
- Three young volunteers and interns at Southampton National Park City
- 12 sessions at different sites for young people with experts on climate to help shape a theatre performance



New Forest Code

- Ranger Code operations – Mountie, Wolf (fly tipping), campsites, pony feeding/petting operation with Forestry England.
- National Heathland Conference and 'Bark Ranger' back on social media highlighting responsible dog walking
- Preparation for dark nights (animal accidents).



Follow the New Forest code

The New Forest is a unique place with rare wildlife and free-roaming livestock. Thank you for helping us care for this special place by following the simple New Forest code:

Keep your distance from the animals – don't feed or touch them*	Keep dogs under control. Don't let dogs approach or chase any animals	Stick to the permitted cycle tracks
Take home litter and dog waste	Park only in car parks	Drive with care – animals on the road!
No fires or barbecues*	No wild camping	Help wildlife by keeping to the main tracks

*Failure to comply may result in a fixed penalty of £100 or being taken to court and a fine of up to £1,000.

- Breamore Railway line £300k scheme thanks to funding from National Grid's Landscape Enhancement Initiative
- Dilton Bridleway improvements (right)
- Knightwood Oak Trail improvements.

- Commissioned by the Partnership Plan Leaders Panel to increase understanding of how special the National Park is for nature.
- Looks at the wildlife and people behind the scenes.
- Launch at the New Forest Show and theme of our stand.
- Images by internationally-renowned photographer Steve Poole.
- Over 123,000 impressions online to date.



PedAll

New Forest Show:

- 1,000 riders tried out the bikes on a small ride over the three days.
- £3,000 raised.

Pass the PedAll dawn til dusk challenge with Ride Leader Gareth Jones at New Park, Brockenhurst:

- 12 hours cycled
- Supported by over 160 riders
- More than 133 miles ridden
- 200 laps completed.
- Around £5,000 raised for PedAll.




Arts

Prosper – Our Duty

Working in partnership with other organisations it is also the Authority's duty to seek to foster the economic and social well-being of the local communities within the National Park.



Greenprint

Greenprint network to be established to share knowledge and practice across the five themes of:

- Climate resilience
- Nature (blue and green infrastructure)
- Natural Health Service
- Quality Design and Build
- Green skills and jobs.

Agreement to set up local authority network to collaborate on common work areas such as :

- air quality
- water quality
- flood prevention.

NPA, University of Southampton and Hampshire County Council secured funding for fellowship to review the region's green skills/jobs offer and make recommendations.



BMW Recharge In Nature project

Recharge in Nature project by BMW with National Parks Partnerships funding deployed:

- new twin charging point at Sway (the only village previously without charging points).
- the appointment of two apprentice rangers.
- 80 young people to better connect with nature and feel inspired to protect it.



Sustainable Communities Fund

- Woodgreen Shop: £2,000 grant towards installing an extra array of roof solar panels to contribute around 30% of the shop's electricity consumption saving £4,000 a year and helping to reduce carbon emissions.
- East Boldre Village Hall: £2,000 for new audiovisual equipment so a wider range of activities can be offered.



New Forest Marque

- Currently 183 members, including 39 members of Inspired arts and crafts branch.
- Celebrated the 20th anniversary at the New Forest Show
- Inspired members' first collective exhibition as part of Hampshire Open Studios.
- Events included the New Forest Show; Romsey Show; Damerham.
- Marque award as part of New Forest Business Partnership's Brilliance in Business Awards; celebrated members' successes in the Great Taste Awards and British Food Fortnight.

Enjoy the Forest visits survey

Enjoy the Forest visits survey with Go New Forest and Forestry England launched end June.

743 responses received over 11 weeks.

Currently analysing the responses to help inform future recreation management.



New Forest Tour

- 20th anniversary.
- 14% drop in patronage compared to 2023 over 11-week season.
- Residents' ticket sales saw a 13% increase.



Walking and cycling

- Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) - extensive network of cycle routes across the Forest, as well as walking zones for the main residential areas, proposed.
- Eight-week consultation by Hampshire County Council ends Sunday 3 November
- Active Travel England visit
- Forestry England presentment re cycle routes (off-road)
